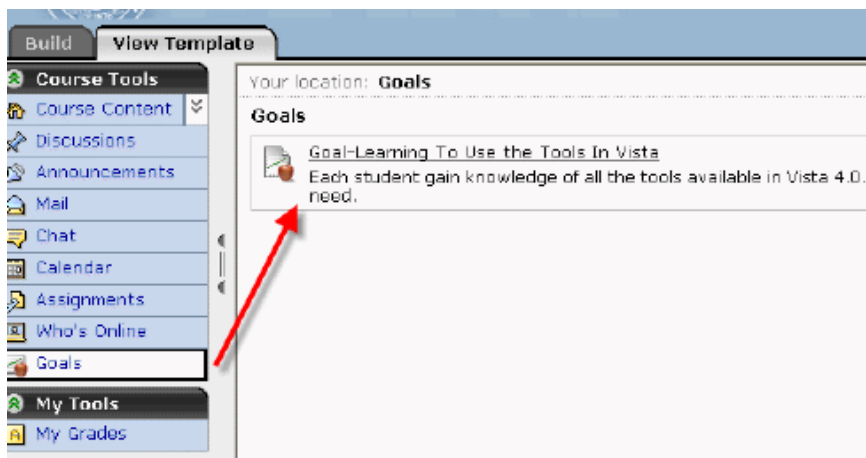
Student Learning Activities

- Assessments**
Create quizzes, self tests, and surveys.
- Assignments**
Create assignments for Students to submit online. Students can work independently or in groups.
- Goals**
Create goals that list the qualitative and quantitative performance expected in your course.

Assessments and Assignments create interest and provide another layer of learning for the students. Create a quiz, self-test, and/or use the survey as an evaluation tool for pre-assessment or post-assessment for a module or concept or the entire course. The Assignment tool provides a way for students to send finished products to you either individually or in groups.

There are other types of assessments besides tests, don't forget to add portfolios, projects, and papers to your online course. A portfolio can be created for the student to have a record of what they have learned in the class. Group projects can be created whereby one student presents a power point to summarize a topic and the other students "talk" about the topic in a discussion posting. In 4.0 there is a Collaborative Document tool. This would allow a group of students to work on a project or paper together.

Learning Modules: Use the Learning Module tool to organize your content

Content Tools

- Learning Modules**
Organize and present content and activities to Students.
- Local Content**
Allow Students to easily access large files from a portable medium, such as CD-ROM, instead of downloading the files from the Learning System.
- Media Library**
Create a glossary or image collection.
- SCORM**
Import SCORM-compliant packages, or modules, to be used as course content. SCORM modules can be added to the Home Page, other folders, and learning modules.
- Web Links**
Create links to Internet resources.

Local Content: Allows you to link to a CD-ROM so that students can access large files or videos.

Media Library: This tool is where you can create a collection of audio, video, or photos, or a glossary and you can allow students to add to these collections.

Web Links : This tool is where you add URLs or links to Internet resources. Students can add their own links to this collection.

After you have chosen your tools, your course home page will open. There are options that you can choose to create a unique home page look and they are found under the icon "[Manage Course.](#)"
